



With the 2024 Atlantic hurricane season predicted to be particularly active, New Jersey schools must take proactive steps to ensure safety and minimize disruptions. <u>The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)</u> forecasts an 85% chance of an above-normal hurricane season, expecting between 20-25 named storms, driven by favorable conditions such as warmer sea surface temperatures and a developing La Niña pattern.

Important Things to Know:

- Atlantic hurricane season is June 1 to November 30.
- Know the difference between a watch or a warning.
- WATCH: Conditions are possible for a hurricane to occur.
- WARNING: Severe weather is imminent or occurring, take action.

Key Preparation Strategies:

- Develop a hurricane preparedness plan.
- Ensure communication channels are in place.

• Regular inspections of school buildings are necessary to ensure they can withstand hurricaneforce winds. This includes securing loose objects, reinforcing roofs and windows, and checking the building's foundation.

• Make sure backup power and supplies are readily available, such as generators and emergency lighting.

• Implement flood mitigation measures like installing flood barriers and checking for blocked drains.

By taking these steps, New Jersey schools can enhance their resilience against hurricanes, ensuring the structural integrity of the buildings to minimize costly claims during the hurricane season.

Please prepare for the possibility of an above-normal Atlantic hurricane season. Should an event occur, the NJSIG team is prepared to respond to weather-related emergencies such as hurricanes, hailstorms, tornadoes and floods.

Don't Let Mold Invite Itself In to an Empty School!

School is officially out for the summer! With students and teachers enjoying their summer break, be on the lookout for an uninvited guest trying to fill the void: mold. The warm, humid summer months create the perfect breeding ground for mold, which can thrive in vacant, unventilated spaces of school buildings. Mold not only poses health risks but can also lead to costly damages and repairs.

Essential tips and strategies for preventing mold growth from the <u>United States Environ-</u> mental Protection Agency:

- Maintain air circulation and control humidity levels
- Use fans, air conditioners and dehumidifiers
- Provide adequate ventilation by opening vents and air ducts
- Address any plumbing leaks or roof leaks immediately to prevent moisture buildup.
- Inspect and clean regularly
- Check for moldy odors.
- Look for water stains, discoloration on ceilings, walls, floors and window sills.
- Use mold-inhibiting cleaning products to clean surfaces, especially in high-risk areas.
- Respond promptly
 - Clean and dry damp or wet building materials and furnishings to prevent mold growth.
- Fix the source of the water problem or leak.
- Clean mold off hard surfaces with water and detergent, dry completely.
- Preventive maintenance
- Schedule regular maintenance for HVAC systems to ensure they are functioning efficiently.
- Ensure roofs and gutters are in good condition and free of debris to prevent water accumulation.
- Check and repair any seals around windows and doors to prevent moisture from entering.
- Remove spots and stains from floors and carpets immediately, using the flooring manufacturer's recommended techniques.
- Ensure that all remediation work follows safety guidelines to prevent mold spores from spreading.

By taking these protective steps, vacant school buildings can be protected from mold during the summer months to ensure students and teachers return in the fall to a clean and healthy learning environment.
